THE GAME

Florida Tech will play its first NCAA Division II opponent on its first-ever road trip Saturday to Newberry College. The game will mark Newberry's home opener for its 100th season of football. The game will mark the Wolves' 970th game in school history as they have an all-time record of 396-537-36 (.397).

THE CAPTAINS

Florida Tech will be represented by its three season-long captains: Justin Arcune, Collin O'Neal and Ramsey Sellers. Earning captaincy based on his performance during practice this week is Sean Ashley.

RECAP OF NEWBERRY GAME

Newberry is coming off a 35-32 win in its season-opener last Saturday at Elizabeth City State. The Wolves scored all five of their touchdowns on the ground as they rushed for 256 yards on 47 carries for an average of 5.4 yards per carry. Six different running backs ran the ball with five scoring one touchdown each.

Quarterback W.T. Murden led the team with 95 rushing yards. He also went 16-of-29 passing for 208 yards and two interceptions. His primary target was Corey Washington, who reeled in six catches for a team-leading 96 yards. Two of Murden's passes went for 40-plus yards. Washington snagged a pass for 45 yards and Byron Dickerson's lone catch was 44 yards.

Inside linebacker Taylor McDonnell paced the team with nine tackles. Outside linebacker Edmond Robinson recorded seven tackles, three were for a loss.

Newberry held Elizabeth City State to 77 rushing yards, but it surrendered 374 yards in the air.

The game between Newberry and Elizabeth City State was a shootout with the two teams remaining close in every quarter. The point difference in the third and fourth quarter was only one point. Only six points were scored the entire second quarter as Newberry led 13-10 entering the locker room.

GIVE CREDIT WHERE IT'S DUE

Edmond Robinson, a junior outside linebacker, was named South Atlantic Conference Defensive Player of the Week last Monday after totaling seven tackles, three were for a loss, and a pass breakup.

During the preseason, the South Atlantic Conference recognized eight Newberry players for being named preseason all-conference. They included first teamers wide receiver Corey Washington, defensive lineman Letavious Williams and long snapper Austin Crook. Second-team honorees were quarterback W.T. Murden, wide receiver Jason Livingston, offensive lineman Jamal Ellis, linebacker B.J. Mazyck and defensive back David Davis.

Also, Washington and Williams were named USA Football Network Preseason All-Americans. Washington was a third-team honoree at wide receiver and Williams earned honorable mention on the defensive line.

Washington was a first team all-South Atlantic Conference selection in 2012, totaling 51 receptions for 776 yards and nine touchdowns. Williams was named second team All-SAC last year. He had 24 tackles, 7.5 tackles for a loss and three sacks.

X MARKS THE SPOT

Wide receiver Xavier Milton shined in Florida Tech's inaugural contest versus Stetson last Saturday, leading all players with 10 catches and 151 receiving yards. The redshirt junior also hauled in FIT's first-ever touchdown, tying the game at 13 with 6:25 left in the fourth quarter.

WATCH: JARVIS GILES

Jarvis Giles has a history of playing football in South Carolina as he was a Gamecock in 2009 and 2010. Between his freshman and sophomore seasons, he played in 15 games and ran the ball 54 times for 289 yards and one touchdown.

His biggest game up to this point of his collegiate career was in a 38-16 win over Florida Atlantic on Sept. 19, 2009 in Columbia, S.C. He racked up 113 yards and one touchdown on 11 carries.

EDGE: FLORIDA TECH

Stetson led 10-3 at halftime of Saturday's sold out inaugural game at Palm Bay High School's Pirate Stadium, however, the Panthers dominated the second half to outscore the Hatters 17-3. They controlled the time of possession, 19:35 to 10:25.

The Panthers finished the game holding the upper-hand in first downs, 25-10, net yards rushing 206-71, net yards passing 235-117 and total offense 441-188. Stats from the game can be viewed on the last page of these game notes.

A RARE OCCASSION

Florida Tech's Gulf South Conference opener against currently ranked No. 12 West Alabama will be televised nationally on CBS Sports Network on Sept. 19 at 8 p.m. Melbourne area fans can watch the game on digital cable channel 106 in standard definition and 1137 in high definition.

Prep work for the game has been on-going since FIT was chosen as one of six NCAA Division II schools to host a national TV game.

It will be the school's first national TV game for any of its varsity sports.

PACKED HOUSE SEES FIRST WIN

Over 5,400 Florida Tech fans packed Pirate Stadium on Sept. 7 for the Panthers' inaugural game. The game sold out Aug. 28 after 1,043 student tickets were handed away to FIT students.



To accommodate the additional fans, temporary bleachers were installed on the south end zone.

MAKING HISTORY

Florida Tech is one of 12 institutions adding football this fall. Of that amount, a record nine schools are members of the NCAA. The Panthers, members of NCAA Division II, will see two of those 12 schools over the course of the season, Stetson in their inaugural game on Sept. 7 and Warner in their Homecoming Game on Oct 26.

Stetson will compete at the NCAA Division I FCS level and Warner is an NAIA member.

Also adding football is Alderson Broaddus (Division II), Berry College (DIII), Hendrix College (DIII), Houston Baptist (DI FCS), Mercer (DI FCS), Oklahoma Baptist (NAIA), Reinhardt (NAIA), Southwestern (DIII) and North Carolina at Charlotte (DI FCS).

STARTS AT THE TOP

Florida Tech President and Chief Executive Officer Anthony J. Catanese has successfully started football now at two NCAA schools, Division I Florida Atlantic University in Boca Raton and FIT.

Catanese, now in his 11th year in Melbourne, has more than doubled the athletics landscape since he arrived in 2002. He has added men's and women's golf, women's soccer, men's and women's tennis, men's lacrosse, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's track & field, football and women's lacrosse will begin in 2013-14.

FAMILIAR FACES

Head coach Steve Englehart was previously the offensive coordinator at his alma mater of Indiana State in 2010. Three members of his coaching staff - defensive line coach Rod Hardy, special teams coordinator Dan Sabock and head strength and conditioning coach Ethan Tyler - were previously at Indiana State.

Hardy played four years on the defensive line from 2008-11. Sabock was the Sycamores' outside linebackers coach for one season in 2011. Tyler, a Terre Haute, Ind. native like Englehart, earned his master's in exercise science in 2009. He then followed Englehart to Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology for its strength and conditioning coach position and was there for two seasons in that capacity.

The Panthers' offensive coordinator, Jayson Martin, served three seasons as the offensive coordinator for Englehart at Rose-Hulman, leading the Fightin' Engineers to numerous offensive records. When Englehart accepted the offensive coordinator position at Indiana State, Martin was named interim head coach at RHIT and led the Fightin' Engineers to a 6-4 record.

TO BE THE BEST, YOU HAVE TO PLAY THE BEST

The Gulf South Conference has produced 11 national championships in football. Three of those titles have come in the last nine years, including last year's NCAA Division II National Champion Valdosta State. The Blazers have won three national championships since 2004 and were the runner-ups in 2002.

North Alabama won the title three straight years from 1993-95 after finishing second in 1985. Delta State hoisted the trophy in 2000 and finished second in 2010.

HOME SWEET HOME

FIT plays its home games Palm Bay High School's Pirate Stadium in Melbourne. The 4,980-seat facility is comprised of synthetic turf. It features two press boxes, one on the home side, or east stands, and a brand new box on the west side.

GET 'EM EARLY

Single-game general admission tickets are available for the TV game and all of the remaining five home games for \$10 for adults and \$5 for FIT faculty and staff with school ID, seniors ages 65 and above, children ages 5-16 and active duty military with ID. Children under five years of age are free.

HIGH DEMAND

The Panthers sold out of their premium season tickets for their first-ever season Aug. 10. In total, nearly 1,300 seats were sold between the 30-yard lines in the east side stands at Palm Bay High School's Pirate Stadium.
